Coronavirus: South Yorkshire Maths Hub

SLE Development Programme: Expression of Interest

Maths SLEs are invited to register interest in a school improvement programme with their local Maths Hub.

A register of Expression of Interest has opened for a tailored programme, run by the Maths Hubs Programme, to support Specialist Leaders of Education (SLEs) in maths to develop their school improvement work. In 2020/21, four cohorts of SLEs (in the North, Midlands, South and South-West) will each collaborate in three workshops, convened and led by the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCETM).

The programme is designed to enable SLEs from both primary and secondary schools to develop maths-specific leadership capacity and capability in the schools they support. This is a fully funded programme with some financial support also provided to enable the release of SLEs to take part. Secondary Mastery Specialists Programme

Maths Hubs, working in conjunction with the NCETM, are now seeking applications from secondary schools that wish to nominate 'lead teachers' to take part in an important three-year professional development programme leading to the designation of *Secondary Mastery Specialist*.

Schools nominating teachers for this role would be committed to the development of teaching for mastery in the lead teacher's classroom, across their maths department and, later on, to facilitate and support the development of teaching for mastery in a small number of other interested secondary schools within their Maths Hub area.

Teachers should complete the <u>application form</u> by **5pm on Wednesday 22 April**. An email will then be sent to the headteacher in order for him/her to complete the supporting statement. This needs to be completed by **5pm on Monday 27 April**.

Core Maths Work Shop

With the number of centres offering Core Maths increasing year on year it is important that our year 11 students know that the course exists, where they can go to study it, what its intentions are and how it will go on to help them in their A levels, Higher Education courses and/or life beyond formal education.

This event aims to inform teachers of mathematics in 11-16 schools of the ethos of the Core Maths course, why it is important that their students know about it when making their choices for post-16 study and will give real practical examples of Core Maths style problems that could be used in their teaching of GCSE mathematics.

The Workshop will run from **4pm - 6pm on 25th March at King Ecgbert School**. The event is **FREE** to all state school teachers.
